Playoff Rules – 2025

All regular season rules apply unless otherwise stated. Click link to see <u>Regular Season Rules</u>.

The following are the specific playoff rules, clarifications, and reminders.

1. Game Play

- The **home** team for each game, except the championship, will be the team with the **higher** regular season ranking.
- All games are scheduled for **7 innings**. At the **1 hour 15-minute** mark from the scheduled start time, the umpire will declare the next inning to be the 'open inning,' unless the game is already in the 7th inning.
- All **open innings** will be completed unless the home team is leading after the visiting team's at-bat.
- Teams must field a minimum of **8 players.** A **5-minute** grace period will be allowed, but the game clock begins at the scheduled start time.
- Call-ups are **prohibited**. All players must come from their own team's roster.
- All players MUST wear their official team jersey, buttoned up. No jersey, no game, unless pre-approved by the convenor. Teams unable to field 8 players in jerseys will forfeit the game.
- Any team **forfeiting** a game will receive a loss and a **\$300 fine**.
- Mercy rule: A team losing by more than 20 runs at the end of an inning will lose by mercy.
- Umpires will maintain a fair pace. Balls and strikes may be called against teams delaying play.
- If a game is tied after the open inning, the 'International Tiebreaker Rule'
 applies: the last official batter starts on second base, this baserunner cannot be
 replaced with a courtesy runner and must remain on the bases until they cross the
 home plate line. The inning begins with one out, and both teams bat until the
 winner is decided.
- Each team is allowed up to **5 substitute runners** per game, with a different player used each time. No extra substitutes are permitted in extra innings.
- In case of rain, at least 4 complete **innings** must be played (3½ if the home team is leading) for the game to count.
- Only 1 injured player may be removed from the batting order at a time. Teams
 must still field 8 players. No injured players can be removed in the 6th inning
 or later; if unable to bat, the spot will be recorded as an out.

• All **bats** must meet the requirements outlined in **Rule** #8 of the regular-season rules. If in doubt, consult the convenor or umpire before the game.

2. Championship Game

- The **undefeated** team from the upper bracket will be the **home** team, regardless of regular season standings.
- The home team may choose to **bat first** or **second**.
- If a **rubber match** is required, the home/visitor roles will **switch**. Rubber matches will be scheduled after other championship games are completed.

3. Game Misconduct

- Consumption of alcohol or smoking (tobacco or cannabis) during a game is prohibited. Violations will result in the captain being ejected and suspended for the next game. Bleachers and surrounding areas are considered part of the dugout.
- Players who **argue** with **umpires** unnecessarily will be **ejected** with no right of appeal. The **suspension** applies for the rest of the game and the following game.
- **Profanity** or **unsportsmanlike** conduct will result in **ejection**. Continued abuse or threats may result in further **disciplinary** action, depending on severity.

4. Roster Eligibility

- Players must have participated in at least 7 regular-season games to qualify for playoffs.
- Captains must review the official photo roster of qualified players before games.
- Teams using ineligible players risk forfeit; the player will be removed from the roster.
- Impersonating another player will result in immediate team disqualification.

5. Homerun Rule

- The '3 **plus** 1' rule applies: A team may not exceed **3 more** untouched, over-the-fence home runs than its opponent.
- Any excess home run will result in the batter being declared out.
- If a ball is deflected over the fence by a fielder's glove while attempting a catch, it is scored as a **four-base error**, not a home run.
